## What Should I Bring to Canada?

### Important Documents

- ✓ Passport
- ✓ Visa or Entry Permit
- ✓ Letter of Acceptance
- ✓ Study Permit Acceptance Letter (if applicable)
- ✓ Custodian Letter
- ✓ Homestay or Accommodation Information

### Any Special Medications

If you require special medications, be sure to bring them with you along with a copy of the doctor's prescription. If you have allergies, be sure to bring the medication that you use or prefer. **Please ensure that all important medical information has been shared with the program.**

### Scent-Free Schools & Homestays

Please do not wear perfume, cologne or other fragrances at school or in your homestay. Fragrances can cause serious allergic reaction

### Clothing

Students are not required to wear uniforms. Weather in Victoria is generally mild, but summer can be quite warm. There may still be some rainy days. Remember to bring a hat and sunscreen as you will be doing outdoor activities.

### Money

While you are able to pay with credit cards almost everywhere, it's a good idea to always carry a little cash with you for the trip.

### Electronics

Canada's electrical supply and electrical outlets are 120 Volts and 60 Hertz (sockets, wall plugs.) Plug converters can be purchased at the airport or at various local stores.

Many students find it useful to have an electronic language translator to assist them with English words

### **Adjusting to Life in Canada**

It is normal to feel some homesickness. This should pass. Some things students find helpful include:

- Getting fresh air outside
- Going for walks, to the gym or to the pool
- Keep up routines – go to camp each day
- Find a place in the city that feels comfortable (i.e. coffee shop, bench by the ocean, etc.)

If you continue to feel unhappy, let your host family, teacher or homestay coordinator know.

## Living in Homestay

Please communicate with your host family before travelling. Get to know each other.

You may find your living environment and the food very different than you are used to. Please keep an open mind and ask questions if you are not sure about something.

Spend time with your host family, especially at the beginning of your stay. Dinner time is a great time to get to know each other.

Please make an effort to keep your bedroom tidy and clean up after yourself.

### **Arrivals**

Host Families will pick students up from the Victoria International Airport (YYJ.) Please let host families know if there are any changes to your flight plans.

### **Arrivals with Natural Parents**

Host families will pick students up from the airport, ferry terminal or the hotel where their parents are staying. All visits to host family homes must be coordinated through the Homestay Department. Visits may be scheduled a few days after the student has settled into their new living environment.
